She studied from the age of 8 at the Mestre Tàrrega Conservatory in Castellón with professors Juan Ros and Primi Vallejo, where **she obtained the extraordinary prize of her promotion in Professional Cello Degree**.

Subsequently, she obtained the *Superior Title of Music in the cello specialty* at the *Liceo Superior Music Conservatory, in Barcelona*, with Professor Lluís Claret. Later, *she obtained a Master's degree in Interpretation specializing in cello at ESMUC, in Barcelona*, with Professor José Mor.

She has taken improvement courses and received advice from teachers Anna Mora, María Macedo, J.Enrique Bouché, Mayte García, Manuel Santapau, Marc Coppey, Pietro Serafín, Miguel Jiménez, György Déri and Yo-Yo Ma.

She won first prize in Modality A, Category III, bowed string, plucked and piano specialty of the "XIII Concurs Obert d'Interpretació per a Jòvens Vila de Betxí" in 2016.

She has collaborated with numerous chamber groups, such as the "Casals Quartet", the "Nouarcs" group of cellists, the group made up of teachers and students from the "Love in Syria" Lyceum, among others. She is currently part of the cello duo "Duo Suggia".

She has belonged to and has been a guest member of numerous orchestras such as the Castelló Youth Symphony Orchestra (JOSC), the Barcelona Youth Orchestra (JOSB), the Castelló Symphony Orchestra (OSC), the Supramúsica Orchestra, the Castellón Lyric Orchestra (OLCS), Barcelona and Catalonia National Orchestra (OBC), under the baton of conductors such as Carlos Checa, Henrie Adams, Pinchas Zukerman, Ilan Volkov, Xavier Pastrana, among others.

She has completed the Suzuki level 1 training course and Music Mind Games and has worked as a cello teacher in schools and conservatories such as the "Juan Pedro Carrero y Escola de Músics" music school,

Conservatory "El Musical" of Bellaterra, Waldorf-Steiner school "El Tiler" and Conservatory of Vila-Real "Mestre Goterris" among others.

Se currently works at "Escuela Municipal de Música Vicent Serrano i Gil" and the "SAMVO" school.
